

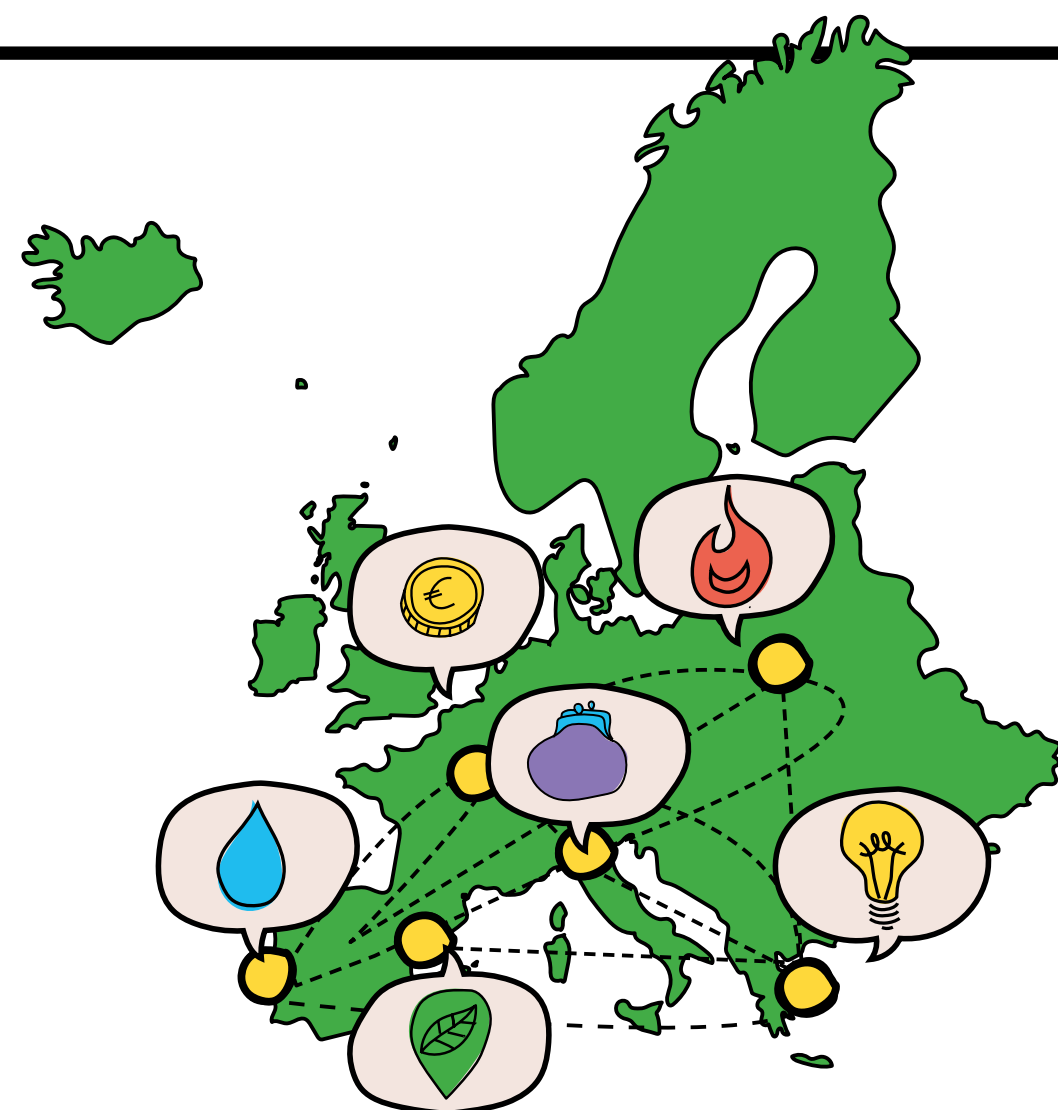
INCLUSIVE CLIMATE ACTION EUROPEAN PILOT

PEER LEARNING

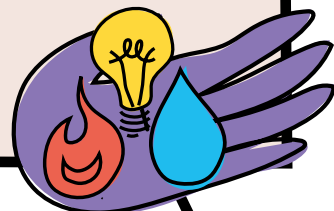
C40 curates peer learning spaces where European cities exchange knowledge, share best practices and discuss challenges to tackle energy poverty. Online working sessions and in-person workshops break silos, offer inspiring examples, and build the capacity to address energy poverty through inclusive and equitable climate action.



LISBON (2024)



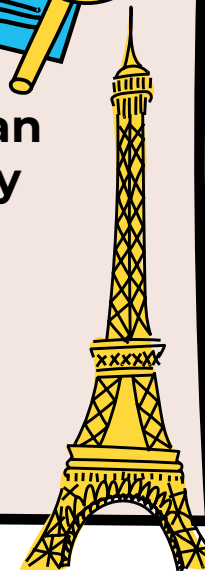
To help deliver affordable renewable energy to low-income residents, Lisbon is designing the Social Solar Tariff initiative to ensure democratisation on accessing energy services, focusing on the implementation of energy communities as a starting point for tackling energy poverty.



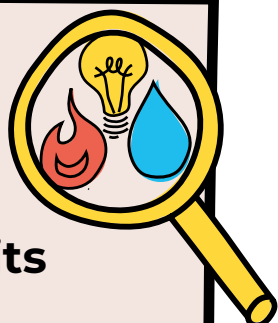
PARIS (2024)



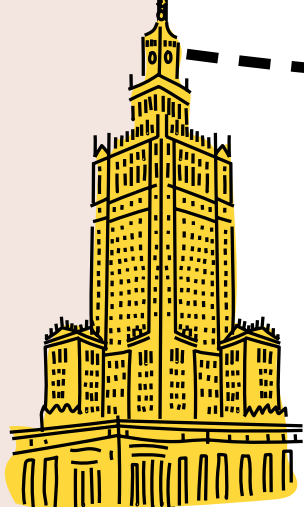
The city has developed an action plan to establish the Paris Energy Poverty Observatory, the first of its kind in Europe. The Observatory will create common knowledge on energy poverty in Paris to guide informed decision-making.



WARSAW (2021-24)



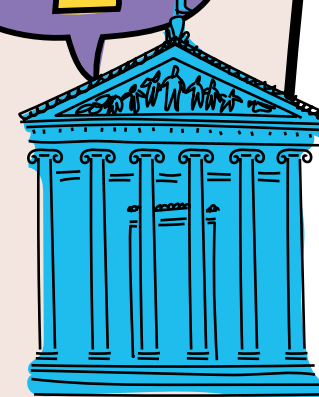
Warsaw has completed 39 energy audits in targeted low-income homes and is using the results to guide the thermo-modernization of 200 single-family buildings. The Carbon-Neutral and Affordable Retrofits for Everyone in Need (CARE) project brings together key stakeholders to develop a tool to monitor social housing stock and target energy efficiency retrofits. The CARE tool compares energy efficiency and social vulnerability across the city to identify areas most at risk of energy poverty, aiding prioritisation strategies for informed decision-making.



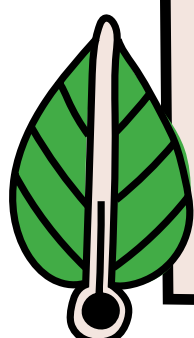
ATHENS (2024)



Athens has established the Energy Poverty Alleviation Office to provide advice to vulnerable households on how to increase their energy efficiency and reduce their energy bills. The city has completed 45 energy efficiency audits in targeted low-income homes to support the operation of the Energy Poverty Alleviation Office and the City's wider approach to tackle energy poverty and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.



BARCELONA (2021-24)



To address the interconnected challenges of energy poverty and climate resilience, Barcelona has undertaken several approaches, including expanding climate shelters, training home care workers on energy poverty and improving thermal comfort in care homes.



MILAN (2023-24)

To better understand and address the energy poverty challenges, different city departments in Milan are working collectively to develop a local Strategy Against Energy Poverty, and the city has provided training to social workers on energy poverty.
